FORM: Color

- What limited color scheme did you employ? Name the color harmony you used in your painting (complementary, split complementary, analogous, triadic etc.) Did you use saturated or desaturated hues in your painting?
- How did your use of color create the intended mood of your painting? Explain.

FORM: Stylistic choices -Acrylic and/or Oil Paint

Explain how your stylistic choices of your reference photo, color scheme you used, imagery
and/or symbolism and stylistic choices (how you applied your paint) all help support
your artistic intentions of making "the invisible, visible".

Creative process summary:

Did your actual studio piece end up looking differently than you had envisioned in your final plan? What challenges came up for you in this project? How did you address these challenges?
